We do not collect any paperwork related to the exam in our office. There may be a process where it should be collected and Guy can comment on that.

Reply from Dr. Guy Hembroff:

As Karen mentioned, you (in coordination with Rochak's committee) will send me the results of his QE after it has been reviewed and scored and I will upload it to the graduate school. Are you combining the QE and Speciality Exam into one exam for Rochak?
