## Lab webpages:

For your lab, there are a number of ways to create a site, depending on how much hands-on work you'd like to do. Basically, your choices are:

- 1) Do it in the university CMS, which is how <a href="https://www.mtu.edu/acmal/">https://www.mtu.edu/acmal/</a> did it. Your departmental coordinator and/or University Marketing and Communications (UMC) can help you get that set up. Requires someone to know (or learn) the CMS, which is fairly straightforward. You are somewhat limited in terms of flexibility, though.
- 2) Set up a Google Site, which is how <a href="https://www.raolab.biomed.mtu.edu/">https://www.raolab.biomed.mtu.edu/</a> did it. Anyone with an <a href="mailto:omtu.edu">omtu.edu/</a> email account can create a Google Site. Here in IT we can also create a custom URL for your Google Site, like raolab. Even easier to use than the CMS, and even less flexibility.
- 3) Set up something yourself in <a href="https://pages.mtu.edu/~pjvansus">https://pages.mtu.edu/~pjvansus</a>, which is how <a href="https://pages.mtu.edu/~jinshant/LabWeb/lab.htm">https://pages.mtu.edu/~jinshant/LabWeb/lab.htm</a>. More flexible than the other options, but requires knowledge of HTML. - 4) We can set up a cPanel for you, like we did for <a href="http://wernerlab.mtu.edu/">http://wernerlab.mtu.edu/</a>. The most flexible option, but requires the most work to set up and maintain. Here, IT is just providing hosting. It is up to you to create content, and if you are using a product like Wordpress, you will need to update and maintain it. If using a custom URL, as in options 2) and 4), you can choose whatever you like if it ends in a departmental subdomain like .me.mtu.edu - for example, mylab.me.mtu.edu. If you want

something without the subdomain, such as <a href="mylab.mtu.edu">mylab.mtu.edu</a>, it would have to be approved by UMC first. We can contact them on your behalf, or you can email them directly at <a href="mylab.mtu.edu">mmtu.edu</a>.
